# to All who Pray the Rosary

- 1. I promise my special protection and the greatest of graces.
- Those who shall persevere in the recitation of my rosary shall receive 2 , some signal grace.
- The rosary shall be a very powerful armor against hell; it will destroy vice, decrease sin, and defeat heresy.
- The rosary will cause virtue and good works to flourish, and will obtain for souls the most abundant divine mercies; it will withdraw the hearts of men from the love of the world and its vanities, and will lift them to the desire of eternal things. or are just deciding to add it to your daily devotions, we hope this resource will help you pray more deeply.

Traditionally, the mysteries correspond to particular days: Sunday & Wednesday - Glorious Monday & Saturday - Joyful

Tuesday & Friday - Sorrowful

Thursday - Luminous

Following this pattern is not required. You may have a particular need that connects to particular mysteries. Using this resource, you can also choose meditations for certain topics, such as for healing or for respect life issues.

Begin with the Sign of the Cross and pray the Apostle's Creed on the Crucifix.

On the first bead, pray one Our Father.

On each of the next three beads, pray one Hail Mary, "for an increase in the virtues of faith, hope, and charity."

Then, pray the Glory Be.

Then announce the first mystery and read the meditation, when available. On the large bead, pray one Our Father. Pray one Hail Mary on each of the 10 small beads. After those prayers, pray one Glory Be.

Announce the next mystery and repeat the process for all 5 decades, then pray the Hail Holy Queen.





# Prayers of the Rosary

#### Apostles' Creed

I believe in God, the Father Almighty, Creator of Heaven and earth; and in Jesus Christ,

His only Son Our Lord, Who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the Virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried.

He descended into Hell; the third day He rose again from the dead; He ascended into Heaven, and sits at the right hand of God, the Father almighty; from thence He shall come to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy Catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body and life everlasting. Amen.

#### Our Father

Our Father, Who art in Heaven, hallowed be Thy Name. Thy Kingdom come, Thy will be done on earth as it is in Heaven. Give us this day our daily bread, and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us, and lead us not into temptation but deliver us from evil. Amen.

#### Hail Mary

Hail Mary, full of grace, the Lord is with you. Blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb, Jesus.

Holy Mary, Mother of God, pray for us sinners now, and at the hour of our death. Amen.

#### Glory Be

Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit, as it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be world without end. Amen

#### Hail Holy Queen

Hail Holy Queen, Mother of mercy, our life, our sweetness and our hope. To thee do we cry, poor banished children of Eve. To thee do we send up our sighs, mourning and weeping in this valley of tears. Turn then, most gracious advocate, thine eyes of mercy towards us, and after this our exile, show unto us the blessed fruit of thy womb, Jesus. O clement, O loving, O sweet Virgin Mary.

## Prayers of the Rosary

Throughout the years, many adaptations have been made to the Rosary as the norm of a particular religious community or a local culture. While the prayers on the previous page are essential to the Rosary, these prayers may or may not be included as is the custom of your Council.

#### Fatima Prayer (Often prayed after the Glory Be)

Oh my Jesus, forgive us our sins. Save us from the fires of Hell. Lead all souls into heaven, especially those who are in most need of Thy mercy.

#### Other Additions

#### Acclamations:

Most Sacred Heart of Jesus, have mercy on us.

Immaculate Heart of Mary, pray for us.

Pray 1 Our Father, 1 Hail Mary, and 1 Glory Be for the intentions of the Holy Father.

#### Concluding Prayer (Often prayed after the Hail Holy Queen)

O God, whose only begotten Son, by His life, death, and resurrection, has purchased for us the rewards of eternal life. Grant, we beseech Thee, that while meditating upon these mysteries of the most holy Rosary of the Blessed Virgin Mary, that we may both imitate what they contain and obtain what they promise, through the same Christ, our Lord. Amen.

#### Prayer to St. Michael

St. Michael the Archangel, defend us in battle. Be our defense against the wickedness and snares of the Devil. May God rebuke him, we humbly pray, and do thou, O Prince of the heavenly hosts, by the power of God, thrust into hell Satan, and all the evil spirits, who prowl about the world seeking the ruin of souls. Amen.

# The Joyful Mysteries



### The Joyful Mysteries A New Beginning

The First Joyful Mystery :

The Annunciation- The Fruit of the Mystery- Humility

"And the angel said to her in reply, 'The holy Spirit will come upon you, and the power of the Most High will overshadow you...for nothing will be impossible for God.' Mary said, 'Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word.' Then the angel departed from her." [Luke 1;35, 37-38]

To start our lives anew, let us open ourselves to receive in faith the love God wishes to pour into our hearts. Then we too can become God's living instruments of peace, hope, and charity because with God, nothing is impossible.

The Second Joyful Mystery:

The Visitation - The Fruit of the Mystery- Love of Neighbor

"During those days Mary set out and traveled to the hill country in haste to a town of Judah, where she entered the house of Zechariah and greeted Elizabeth. When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the infant leaped in her womb." [Luke 1:39-41a]

In that one visit, Mary shows us faith, hope, and charity. Mary teaches us how to live selflessly. In what we say and in what we do, we are here to magnify the Lord through our daily living.

The Third Joyful Mystery:

The Nativity - The Fruit of the Mystery- Poverty of Spirit, Detachment from Material Things

"While [Mary and Joseph] were there, the time came for her to have her child, and she gave birth to her firstborn son. She wrapped him in swaddling clothes and laid him in a manger, because there was no room for them in the inn." [Luke 2: 6-7]

Through Mary and with Joseph's protection, Jesus our Savior was born. Mary and Joseph shared this new life with all those seeking salvation. Embracing the infant Jesus in our hearts can renew our spirit for the sake of peace on earth with faith, hope, and merciful love.

The Fourth Joyful Mystery:

The Presentation - The Fruit of the Mystery - Obedience

"When the days were completed for their purification according to the law of Moses, [Mary and Joseph] took [Jesus] up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord, just as it is written in the law of the Lord." [Luke 2:22-23a]

We learn from the Presentation that patience, prayer, faith, and obedience prepare us for the lives God wants us to lead and give us the dignity to live those lives without hesitation.

The Fifth Joyful Mystery:

Finding of the Child Jesus- The Fruit of the Mystery - Piety, Joy in Finding Jesus

"After three days [Mary and Joseph] found him in the temple, sitting in the midst of the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions, and all who heard him were astounded at his understanding and his answers." (Luke 2:46-47)

For God to help us, we must let Our Lord into our lives so we can grow in wisdom and favor before Him. May God give us the grace to meet difficult challenges, anxieties, and losses with faith, hope, love, and trust. May our hearts never harden and may our lives be transformed with the love of God.



### The Joyful Mysteries For Our Lady

Hail Mary, poor and humble Woman, Blessed by the Most High! Virgin of hope, dawn of a new era, We join in your song of praise, to celebrate the Lord's mercy, to proclaim the coming of the Kingdom and the full liberation of humanity.

Hail Mary, lowly handmaid of the Lord, Glorious Mother of Christ! Faithful Virgin, holy dwelling-place of the Word, Teach us to persevere in listening to the Word, and to be docile to the voice of the Spirit, attentive to his promptings in the depths of our conscience and to his manifestations in the events of history.

Hail Mary, Woman of sorrows, Mother of the living! Virgin spouse beneath the Cross, the new Eve, Be our guide along the paths of the world. Teach us to experience and to spread the love of Christ, to stand with you before the innumerable crosses on which your Son is still crucified.

Hail Mary, woman of faith, First of the disciples! Virgin Mother of the Church, help us always to account for the hope that is in us, with trust in human goodness and the Father's love. Teach us to build up the world beginning from within: in the depths of silence and prayer, in the joy of fraternal love, in the unique fruitfulness of the Cross. Holy Mary, Mother of believers, Our Lady of Lourdes, pray for us. 1.

#### The First Joyful Mystery :

The Annunciation- The Fruit of the Mystery- Humility

"Mary said, "Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word." [Luke 1:38]

Most blessed handmaiden, You had your own plans and dreams. You could have declined when the angel approached you. But you chose to put your life into God's hands. How many times have I resisted putting myself into God's hands because I thought my plan was more important? How many times have I questioned the rightness of His plan? Hail Mary, beloved Mother, open my mind and heart to listen to God's call.

#### The Second Joyful Mystery:

The Visitation - The Fruit of the Mystery- Love of Neighbor

"When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the infant leaped in her womb, and Elizabeth, filled with the holy Spirit, cried out in a loud voice and said, "Most blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb." [Luke 1: 41-42]

Blessed Mother, were you safely betrothed to St. Joseph when you visited St. Elizabeth? Or did her greeting open you to possible scorn? How gracious you were to her with your response. How full of grace you were when you glorified the Lord. How often am I ungracious when someone exposes me to the scrutiny of others? Beloved Mother, teach me to be gracious to everyone who comes into my life.

### The Joyful Mysteries For Our Lady (cont.)

The Third Joyful Mystery:
The Nativity - The Fruit of the Mystery- Poverty of Spirit, Detachment from Material Things

"When the angels went away from them to heaven, the shepherds said to one another, "Let us go, then, to Bethlehem to see this thing that has taken place, which the Lord has made known to us." So they went in haste and found Mary and Joseph, and the infant lying in the manger. When they saw this, they made known the message that had been told them about this child. All who heard it were amazed by what had been told them by the shepherds. And Mary kept all these things, reflecting on them in her heart." (Luke 2: 15-19)

Gracious Mother, you had just given birth to the Son of God in a cave and now strangers wanted to see your son. You welcomed them with a serene smile. Help me greet those who demand things from me with serenity and grace.

The Fourth Joyful Mystery:
The Presentation - The Fruit of the Mystery - Obedience

"The child's father and mother were amazed at what was said about him and Simeon blessed them and said to Mary his mother, "Behold, this child is destined for the fall and rise of many in Israel, and to be a sign that will be contradicted (and you yourself a sword will pierce) so that the thoughts of many hearts may be revealed." (Luke 2: 33-35)

Obedient Mother, was there a voice in your head that told you to take your baby son and flee when Simeon spoke? How often do I want to just turn around and hide from my responsibilities? Help me to be obedient to God's call, no matter where I am and what I need to do.

The Fifth Joyful Mystery:
Finding of the Child Jesus- The Fruit of the Mystery - Piety, Joy in Finding
Jesus

"And he said to them, 'Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?' But they did not understand what he said to them. He went down with them and came to Nazareth, and was obedient to them; and his mother kept all these things in her heart." (Luke 2: 49-51)

Patient Mother, we know that Jesus was not a disobedient child. But you still had to provide guidance to him and then he had disappeared for three days; this child placed in your care by God, our heavenly Father.

My concerns in this world sometimes feel overwhelming. Open my heart to God's guidance to understand what He needs me to do and the fortitude to finish what needs to be done.

The First Joyful Mystery:
The Annunciation- The Fruit of the Mystery- Humility

Most Holy Trinity: Our Father in Heaven, who chose Mary as the fairest of Your daughters; Holy Spirit, who chose Mary as Your Spouse; God the Son who chose Mary as Your Mother, in union with Mary we adore Your Majesty and acknowledge Your supreme, eternal dominion and authority.

Mary, Immaculate Virgin, Our Mother, Patroness of our land, we praise you and honor you and give ourselves to you. Protect us from every harm. Pray for us, that acting always according to your will and the Will of your Divine Son, we may live and die pleasing to God. Amen. 2.

The Second Joyful Mystery:

The Visitation - The Fruit of the Mystery- Love of Neighbor

Mighty God, by whose grace Elizabeth rejoiced with Mary and greeted her as the mother of the Lord: look with favor on \_\_\_\_\_\_ that, with Mary, we may magnify your Holy Name and rejoice to acclaim her Son our Savior, who is alive and reigns with you, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, now and forever.

The Third Joyful Mystery:

"For a child is born to us, a son is given to us; upon his shoulder dominion rests. They name him Wonder-Counselor, God-Hero, Father-Forever, Prince of Peace. (Isaiah 9:5)

After three days of searching for Jesus, Mary and Joseph must have felt relief and deep joy when they finally found Him. Initially, they did not even know He wasn't in the caravan, as it was such a large, bustling crowd. How often do we get caught up in busyness and crowded thoughts, not even noticing Jesus? When we need to find Him again, may we look to His Church and Her Sacraments to find the true joy only God can give.



### The Joyful Mysteries For Victims of Violence

Opening Reflection: Sometimes it is difficult to ponder the Joyful Mysteries, especially in times of tragedy. It is with sadness that we remember the victims of violence, their families, their communities, first responders and law enforcement. Even so, St. Paul tells us to "Rejoice in the Lord always." We know these sad times will not last forever. In Mark 10:14 Jesus said, "Let the children come to me." May the children and adults who have died through senseless violence rest in God's peace. For those who survive, may they find healing and peace.

The First Joyful Mystery :
The Annunciation- The Fruit of the Mystery- Humility

When we recall the angel appearing to Mary, telling her of her selection to be the Savior's Mother, we sit in awe of her ability to offer her fiat. There would be many joys and sorrows that accompanied that fiat. May we, in humility, accept the joys and the sorrows that we find in our lives.

The Second Joyful Mystery:
The Visitation - The Fruit of the Mystery- Love of Neighbor

Just as Mary traveled immediately to minister to her cousin Elizabeth, may we show charity to those suffering the unspeakable pain of the loss of loved ones, whether through war, mass shootings, domestic violence or any other crime.

The Third Joyful Mystery:
The Nativity - The Fruit of the Mystery- Poverty of Spirit, Detachment from Material Things

The Holy Family has three members. We pray for the strength of all families, no matter their size. We pray for extended family and community members to assist and minister to parents in this time of dire need.

### The Joyful Mysteries For Victims of Violence (cont.)

The Fourth Joyful Mystery:
The Presentation - The Fruit of the Mystery - Obedience

In Luke 2:22-23, we hear the story of Simeon who had held the baby Jesus as his parents brought the Child, according to law, to the temple. May we acknowledge right from wrong and promote a respect for human life from conception to natural death.

The Fifth Joyful Mystery:
Finding of the Child Jesus- The fruit of the Mystery - Piety, Joy in Finding Jesus

When tragedy strikes, many people have difficulty seeing Jesus in the midst of their pain, yet we know He is there. May our own lives, our prayer, and our ministry give witness to the joy we have known in finding Jesus in the good times and the bad.



### The Joyful Mysteries For Peace in the World & Conversion of Sinners

The First Joyful Mystery:
The Annunciation- The Fruit of the Mystery- Humility

The Angel Gabriel appeared to Mary to tell her she would be the Mother of the Son of God. Mary declared herself to be the handmaid of the Lord. An Angel also appeared to Joseph, telling him not to be afraid to accept Mary as his wife.

This was the beginning of the Holy Family, but it was a rocky and dangerous beginning—travel to Bethlehem in late pregnancy, birth in a cave that was a stable, later fleeing to Egypt to escape the wrath of Herod, returning much later to Nazareth where Jesus could grow up in relative safety and obscurity, and then just the day-to-day life in that small town. Mary and Joseph answered the call of the angel in spite of the difficulties and dangers they encountered.

Lord, we know that many families today are suffering from the stress for more than a year due to the pandemic, grief for family members who have died, loss of jobs and income. There are many families in which members are estranged from each other, sometimes for months and even many years. The pandemic has only heightened the sorrow and made it more difficult for families to reconcile. Your Mother, Our Lady of Fatima, asked us to pray for the renewal of Christian family life and peace in the world. May we take her message to heart, proclaim God's love for families, knowing that peace in our families can lead to peace in the world. Let us be true servants of the Lord, and may Our Lady of Fatima bless our work.

"When Elizabeth heard Mary's greeting, the infant leaped in her womb, and Elizabeth, filled with the Holy Spirit cried out in a loud voice and said, "Most blessed are you among women, and blessed is the fruit of your womb." (Luke 1:41-42)

The traditional greeting Our Lady would have given to St. Elizabeth would have been "Shalom" which means peace. We pray through the intervention of Mary, Our Mother, and St. Elizabeth that we too bring peace to those we meet.

### The Joyful Mysteries For Peace in the World & Conversion of Sinners (cont.)

The Third Joyful Mystery:

The Nativity - The fruit of the Mystery- Poverty of Spirit, Detachment

In the days a decree went out from Caesar Augustus that all the world should be enrolled. This was the first enrollment, when Quirinius was governor of Syria.

Joseph went from Galilee to to Judea, to the city of David, which is called Bethlehem, because he was of the house and lineage of David, to be enrolled with Mary who was with child. While they were there, the time came for her to be delivered. She gave birth to her first born son and wrapped him in swaddling clothes, and laid him in a manger, because there was no place for them at the inn.

In that region there were shepherds out in the field keeping watch over their flock at night. An angel of the Lord appeared to them, and the glory of the Lord shone around them, and they were filled with fear, but the angel said to them, "Be not afraid, for I bring good news of great joy." For to you is born this day in the city of David a savior, who is Christ the Lord. Glory to God in the highest. (Luke 2:1-14)

Jesus, you lovingly accepted poverty when you were placed in the manger in the stable, although You were our God and Redeemer; grant that I may have the spirit of poverty.

The Fourth Joyful Mystery:
The Presentation - The Fruit of the Mystery - Obedience

"When the days were completed for their purification according to the law of Moses, they took him up to Jerusalem to present him to the Lord, just as it is written in the law of the Lord." (Luke 2: 22-23a)

Mary and Joseph's loving obedience is a sign that they trusted in God's promise of salvation. What's more, Simeon prophesies to Mary that she will experience sorrows as she follows her Son. The actions of Joseph and Mary teach us to always trust in our Lord's promises regardless. In our obedience, may we offer up whatever trials and tribulations we may face for the sake of peace and healing in our world.

The Fifth Joyful Mystery:
Finding of the Child Jesus- The Fruit of the Mystery - Piety, Joy in Finding
Jesus

After three days, Mary and Joseph found young Jesus in the temple, sitting in the midst of the teachers, listening to them and asking them questions, and all who heard him were astounded at his understanding and his answers. His parents were astonished and Mary said: "Son, why have you done this to us? Your father and I have been looking for you with great anxiety." (Luke 2:46-48)

In troubling and uncertain times, we may find it difficult to enter God's house to worship, to pray, to praise and to trust. As a result, we search—wandering through life—in hopes of discovering something better than what we have. Without our Lord to guide us, we will most likely feel lost.

Therefore, to grow in wisdom and favor before our Lord, we must seek our Lord where we know we will find him. "Why were you looking for me? Did you not know that I must be in my Father's house?" (Luke 2:49) At Mass, we are in our Father's house and we present ourselves to God. Are we opening the door to our heart and soul so that Christ can enter our lives to renew and replenish us with healing graces? Like Mary, by giving our consent, our souls can proclaim the greatness of our Lord. Our spirit can rejoice in God our Savior.

Mary, you were filled with sorrow at the loss of Jesus and overwhelmed with joy on finding Him surrounded by Teachers in the Temple; obtain for me the virtue of piety

#### Opening Prayer:

The First Sorrowful Mystery:

The Agony in the Garden- The Fruit of the Mystery- Contrition, Conformity to the Will of God

Most dear Jesus, filled with sorrow and covered with the sweat of blood while praying in the garden and then delivered into the hands of the wicked by a kiss, bound like a robber, and abandoned by Your disciples.

Renewer of hearts, surrounded by fear and anxiety, I take refuge in You. Be my companion as I walk unfamiliar paths. Speak words of healing and forgiveness as I strive to be faithful.

The Second Sorrowful Mystery:

The Scourging at the Pillar - The Fruit of the Mystery- Purity, Mortification

The Carrying of the Cross - The Fruit of the Mystery - Patience

Most dear Jesus, burdened with the weight of the cross and led to the place of execution like a lamb to the slaughter, reckoned with the wicked, blasphemed, and derided. You were given a gall to drink to mitigate your pain.

Awesome God, I take my place in Your amazing world. Hold me in Your hand with the magnificence of all You have made. How majestic are You, O Lord our God.

The Fifth Sorrowful Mystery:
The Crucifixion- The fruit of the Mystery - Salvation, Self-Denial

Most dear Jesus, dying on the cross in the presence of Mary, Your Beloved Mother, pierced with a lance that drew water and blood from Your side. You were taken down and placed in the arms of Your Sorrowful Mother. My Jesus, I thank You for dying on the cross for my sins. Have mercy on us, O Lord.

He then left to make His way as usual to the Mount of Olives, with the disciples following. When they reached the place He said to them, "Pray not to be put to the test." Then He withdrew from them, about a stone's throw away, and knelt down and prayed, "Father," He said, "if you are willing, take this cup away from me. Nevertheless, let Your will be done, not mine" [Luke 22:39-44].

So Pilate released Barabbas for them and having Jesus to be scourged, handed Him over to be crucified. (Matthew 27: 15-26)

God, my ever-present help, I call on you. My world seems to be falling apart and I can no longer manage it all on my own. Let this time of distress teach me that I am not meant to carry it alone. Teach me to rely on your strength.

The Third Sorrowful Mystery:

The soldiers led Him away to the inner part of the palace, that is, the Praetorium, and they called the whole cohort together. They dressed Him up in purple, twisted some thorns into a crown and put it on Him. And they began saluting Him, "Hail, King of the Jews!" They struck His head with a reed and spat on Him; and when they finished making fun of Him, they took off the purple and dressed Him in His own clothes. (Mark 15:16-20)

Healing God, I am filled with deep pain and brokenness. Bring my weary sighing back to life with your healing touch. Heal me so that I may be a channel of your compassion to others.

Large numbers of people followed Him, and of women, too, who mourned and lamented for Him. But Jesus turned to them and said, "Daughters of Jerusalem, do not weep for me; weep rather for yourselves and for your children." (Luke 23:26-28)

When they reached the place called the Skull, they crucified Him there with the two criminals also, one on the right, the other on the left. Jesus said, "Father, forgive them; they do not know what they are doing." Then they cast lots to share out His clothing. It was now about the sixth hour and, with the sun eclipsed, a darkness came over the whole land until the ninth hour and when Jesus cried out in a loud voice, He said, Father, into Your hands I commit my spirit." With these words He breathed His last. (Luke 23:33-46)

Gentle God, receive my tired spirit. Anoint my weary body. Look upon my valiant efforts to care for others with tenderness and bring them to fruition. I entrust my work, my loved ones, my world to you alone.



### The Sorrowful Mysteries For Courage in Adversity

The First Sorrowful Mystery:
The Agony in the Garden- The Fruit of the Mystery- Contrition, Conformity to the Will of God

In the Garden of Gethsemane, Jesus the man was frightened and yet he remained steady in his faithfulness to His Father's will. We also see the weakness of his disciples who ultimately dispersed in fear when Christ was unjustly arrested. Each one of us knows the meaning of despair especially when we face a calamity beyond our control. We feel powerless. Do we run away from our Lord like the disciples or do we pray for an increase in faith, hope, and charity to unite with Jesus as we face our pain and suffering?Heavenly Mother, in our hour of darkness, help us to turn to Our Lord and accept His will in our suffering.

The Second Sorrowful Mystery:
The Scourging at the Pillar - The Fruit of the Mystery- Purity, Mortification

The scorn, the scourging, the great pain and suffering, Christ endured it all and He responded with faith, hope, and merciful love. We are called to do the same. In the dark night of our soul, we will be tested and tried. How we handle life's adversities, tragedies, and feelings of guilt is the choice we will all face. If we choose not to follow Christ's example, we risk closing ourselves off from God and all the love He has to offer. In this Season of \_\_\_\_\_, may faith, hope and love guide us and give us the grace and dignity of Christ to forgive those who persecute us and those we love.

The Third Sorrowful Mystery:
The Crowning with Thorns - The fruit of the Mystery- Moral Courage

With the crown of thorns digging into His scalp, Christ was mocked, struck repeatedly, and suffered deeply the pains and sins of the world. To behold Jesus in His suffering is to realize He endured it all out of love for us and for the sake of our salvation. To alleviate His suffering and ours, we must listen to Our Lord and do whatever He tells us. Let us pray for the courage to alleviate the suffering of Our Lord and of those who face the pain of hopelessness.

### The Sorrowful Mysteries For Courage in Adversity (cont.)

The Fourth Sorrowful Mystery:
The Carrying of the Cross - The Fruit of the Mystery - Patience

Each one of us will face the cross. Each one of us has burdens to bear—illness, loss of a loved one, tragic events, abuse, bullying, addictions, and uncontrollable circumstances. In unity with Christ, these burdens—no matter how large—will not defeat us. What's more, with Christ we have the ability to look beyond our own trials and use our suffering to help others in need. By sharing the grace of mercy, we discover consolation and dignity when all else is bleak. Let us pray for the fortitude to look beyond our own troubles to help those in greater need than ourselves and when our troubles overwhelm us, let us pray to have faith and trust in the Lord's loving mercy.

From His cross, Christ gave us mercy when He said, "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do." He gave us hope when He said to the repentant criminal "today you will be with me in Paradise." "So, first of all, let me assert my firm belief that the only thing we have to fear is... fear itself, nameless, unreasoning, unjustified terror which paralyzes needed efforts to convert retreat into advance. In every dark hour of our national life a leadership of frankness and of vigor has met with that understanding and support of the people themselves which is essential to victory. And I am convinced that you will again give that support to leadership in these critical days."10.

Lord Jesus, in the Garden of Gethsemane, you prayed, "My Father, if it is possible, let this cup pass from me; yet not as I will but as you will." "We seek peace, knowing that peace is the climate of freedom. And now, as in no other age, we seek it because we have been warned, by the power of modern weapons, that peace may be the only climate possible for life itself." 11.

Lord Jesus, you were scourged at the pillar, suffering a brutal beating at the hands of the Roman soldiers. So many of our citizens of all persuasions, ethnic and racial backgrounds have suffered from violence in our cities, our streets, and neighborhoods. We ask for your help Lord, to help all citizens and people of good will to end these violent acts so that peace and freedom prevail.

The Third Sorrowful Mystery:

The Crowning with Thorns - The fruit of the Mystery- Moral Courage

"The American dream endures. We must once again have full faith in our country—and in one another. I believe America can be better. We can become stronger than before. Let our recent mistakes bring a resurgent commitment to the basic principles of our Nation, for we know that if we despise our own government, we have no future. We recall in special times when we have stood briefly, but magnificently united. In these times no prize was beyond our grasp. Our commitment to human rights must be absolute, our laws fair, our natural beauty preserved: the powerful must not persecute the weak, and human dignity must be enhanced."12.

Lord Jesus, the Roman soldiers jammed a crown of thorns onto your head, mocking you with "Hail, King of the Jews." Yet, even in your beaten and bloody state, you were still a model of dignity and forbearance. May we imitate you even when we are reviled and scorned because of our faith, which requires us to speak out against evil and injustice, admit our failures and shortcomings, and resolve to never commit these sins again.

The Fourth Sorrowful Mystery:

The Carrying of the Cross - The Fruit of the Mystery - Patience

"Let us not despair, but act. Let us not seek the Republican answer or the Democratic answer, but the right answer. Let us not seek to fix the blame for the past. Let us accept our own responsibility for the future. 13.

Lord Jesus, you bore the weight of our sins when you carried the cross to your execution. The cross we bear in this election year is heavy for all of our citizens. We are faced with difficult choices to make in electing our leaders at the national, state, and local levels. Many candidates will not satisfy us with their positions on issues that are important to us, and we may have to decide the better choice for the long run rather than the short term. Help us, Lord, to make the right decision, and guide our leaders no matter the party, to make the right decisions for our country.

### The Sorrowful Mysteries For Elections (cont.)

5 The Fifth Sorrowful Mystery: The Crucifixion- The Fruit of the Mystery - Salvation, Self-Denial

"America is never wholly herself unless she is engaged in high moral principles. We as a people have such a purpose today. It is to make kinder the face of the Nation and gentler the face of the world. My friends, we have work to do...We will turn to the only resource we have that in times of need always grows: the goodness and the courage of the American people. For our problems are large, but our heart is larger. Our challenges are great, but our will is greater. And if our flaws are endless, God's love is truly boundless.<sup>14</sup>.

Lord Jesus, "Crucifixion" does not and cannot, begin to express the terrible penalty you endured to redeem us from our sins. Crucifixion is quite probably the most dreadful torture ever devised by man—the pain, humiliation and death by suffocation is too much for most of us to even think about. Yet, you willingly gave your total self out of your great love for us. For you, as for us, death was and is not the end, but a beginning and our lives are changed, not ended. May 2020 be a year for rebirth and change of all kinds in the United States of America—may we conquer the coronavirus, end injustice and prejudice, and overcome our economic and social disparities. May we always seek your guidance and blessings and may your Blessed Mother intercede for us.

The First Glorious Mystery:
